



The Expert Legal Panel on Corporate Complicity in International Crimes will clarify and develop the concept of corporate complicity in international crimes. It will arrive at findings on (1) where legal liability currently lies for corporate complicity in international crimes; (2) where the law seems to be developing or should develop; and (3) where, although legal liability may not be appropriate, moral considerations might require certain actions by business.

You have been invited to meet the Panel because your perspective and insight are considered to be of interest, relevance and use to the Panel in its task. Initially please take a few minutes to speak generally to the Panel about your perspective on the subject of its work.

How do you think that the work of the Panel can contribute to ongoing efforts to identify and clarify the limits of the concept of corporate complicity, especially when the acts are so serious that they can amount to international crimes?

What would be a useful outcome from this process from your perspective and/or from the perspective your organisation/company?

How can the Panel ensure that the results of this initiative have an impact?

Questions to those who have experience of working with business organisations:

What risks have you faced that relate to issues of corporate complicity in very serious human rights violations, and how have you, or your company dealt with them?

Can you explore and discuss a particular situation in which you've been involved where the issues relevant to the Panel's work were at play?
