

## **FES Scenario Building on „Global Economic Governance 2020“ Château de Bossey (Crans-près-Céligny), 14 - 16 November 2008**

**What is your vision of global economic governance in 2020? What would you like to see?**

*“A more legitimate system of global economic governance (more transparency, more accountability) that addresses global issues across the board including:*

- a closer network of international specialized organizations working together under the umbrella of a much lighter UN coordination system*
- a stronger and more binding set of international obligations (with, of course, policy space for subsidiary purposes) including tighter surveillance, more binding dispute settlement*
- an acceptance by countries of the principle of coherence so that international organization are not faced with the same members taking different positions in different fora, and so that domestic coherence links with international coherence”*

*“My wishful thinking is for rather light global structures, underpinned by strong regional groupings that help us to overcome the 'too many actors' syndrome. Major countries/regions will be the key actors along some kind of G20 with regional/international institutions as well monitored service providers with overlapping/competing mandates.”*

*“Effective intergovernmental cooperation that harness market forces for the global good; worldwide recognition of decent work, meaning that all governments and international organizations, working jointly with the ILO, ensure that their actions fully promote and do not undermine its attainment”.*

**What would you not like to see?**

*“The reverse: the proliferation of international organizations the coherence of which would rely on a growing bureaucracy of coordination, and of the coordination of the coordinations.”*

*“Hopefully we will not see the 'total victory' of economic thinking (and thus a neglect of social and environmental concerns) with a too strong influence of new economic powers in international fora”.*

*“Failure to understand shared global interests in addressing climate change & regulating market; Increasing inequality, between and within states and between men & women; Failure to reduce poverty around the world”.*
